

ST. MARIA GORETTI

Patron saint of the youth and purity



July 6 marks the feast day of St. Maria Goretti, a young virgin and martyr whose life is an example of purity and mercy for all Christians. St. Maria Goretti is best known for her commitment to purity and the courageous defense of her faith at the young age of eleven that made her willing to undergo death rather than participate in a sin against God. She is also remarkable for the forgiveness she willingly granted her attacker as she lay on her deathbed.

Maria was born on October 16 1890 in Italy. When she was nine years old, her father, a farmer, died of malaria. Then, her mother had to go to work to support their six children, while Maria took care of the younger children. She prayed the Rosary every night for the repose of her father's soul. She grew in grace and maturity, and her cheerful obedience and piety were noticed by those around her. Though the family's circumstances were extremely difficult, they were very close and loved God.

Pope Francis Welcome ceremony of World Youth Day 2019 Panama City - Part 1

Dear Young People, good evening!

How good it is to get together again, this time in a land that receives us with such radiance and warmth! As we gather in Panama, World Youth Day is once more a celebration of joy and hope for the whole Church ... Today I am happy to say to you: Peter is with you, to celebrate and renew you in faith and hope. Peter and the Church walk with you, and we want to tell you not to be afraid, to go forward with the same fresh energy and restlessness that helps make us happier and more available, better witnesses to the Gospel. To go forward, not to create a parallel Church that would be more "fun" or "cool" thanks to a fancy youth event, as if that were all you needed or wanted. That way of thinking would not respect either you or everything that the Spirit is saying through you.

Not at all! **With you, we want to rediscover and reawaken the Church's constant freshness and youth**, opening ourselves to a new Pentecost, this can only happen if, by our listening and sharing, **we encourage each other to keep walking and to bear witness by proclaiming the Lord through service to our brothers and sisters**, and concrete service at that.

I know getting here was not easy. I know how much effort and sacrifice was required for you to participate in this Day.... A disciple is not merely someone who arrives at a certain place, but one who sets out decisively, who is not afraid to take risks and keeps walking. This is the great joy: to keep walking. You have not been afraid to take risks and to keep journeying...

We come from different cultures and peoples, we speak different languages and we wear different clothes. ... But none of it has stopped us from meeting one another and rejoicing to be together. The reason for this, we know, is that something unites us. Someone is a brother to us... It is because you have that instinct which knows intuitively that "true love does not eliminate legitimate differences, but harmonizes them in a superior unity" (BENEDICT XVI, Homily, 25 January 2006)

gists' study that found all socio-economic groups of people suffered more anxiety, more stress, and more depression during the pandemic, except one — those who attend church regularly. When Christ said to the Apostles at the Last Supper, "Do this in memory of me," He was not only giving a command to the Apostles to celebrate the Eucharist — He was also inviting all of us, Christian brothers and sisters, to come together at the altar, to listen to Him speaking to us in the Scriptures, and to receive Him inside our bodies and our hearts.

... So let us come back to Him at Mass in person, joining together as a worshipping community, to be fed with His word in Scripture, and His body and blood in Holy Communion.

Since the Church always has our spiritual health as her primary consideration, I am reinstating the law which was dispensed because of the pandemic. **Our solemn obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation will come back into force in the Diocese of Oakland on Sunday, August 15, 2021**, the Solemnity of the Assumption of Our Lady into Heaven... REGRESO A LA EUCARISTÍA**

CARTA PASTORAL DEL SR. OBISPO MICHAEL C. BARBER, S.J.

Cómo he anhelado celebrar esta Pascua con ustedes (Lucas 22:15). Cuando la gente pregunta: "¿Por qué debemos ir a Misa?", yo respondo: "Porque Jesús te está esperando allí en la Iglesia, y quiere estar contigo -allí mismo- en la Sagrada Eucaristía". Se trata de un encuentro personal con Jesús que vivimos como individuos Y como una comunidad, en la celebración de la Misa. La celebración de la Eucaristía es el momento y el lugar en el cual podemos permitirle a Cristo que nos ame, y podemos devolverle Su amor...

Cuando Cristo enseñó: "Vengan a mí, todos los que están fatigados y agobiados por la carga, y yo les daré alivio", creo que nos animaba a acercarnos a Él donde está más intensamente presente, en Su propio cuerpo y sangre en el altar del sacrificio en cada Misa. Quizás eso explique el estudio de los sociólogos que encontró que todos los grupos socioeconómicos de personas sufrieron más ansiedad, más estrés y más depresión durante la pandemia, excepto uno: los que asisten a la iglesia con regularidad. Cuando Cristo dijo a los apóstoles en la Última Cena "Hagan esto en memoria mía", no sólo les estaba dando una instrucción a los apóstoles para que celebraran la Eucaristía, sino que también nos invitaba a todos, hermanos y hermanas cristianos a acercarnos juntos al altar, para escucharlo hablar con nosotros de las Escrituras, y recibirllo dentro de nuestro cuerpo y nuestro corazón.

... Así que regresemos a Él en la Misa, en persona, uniéndonos como una comunidad de adoración, para ser alimentados con Su palabra en las escrituras y Su cuerpo y sangre en la Sagrada Comunión.

Dado que la salud espiritual siempre ha sido considerada una prioridad, estoy restableciendo la ley que fue dispensada debido a la pandemia. **Nuestra solemne obligación de asistir a Misa los domingos y los días santos de obligación volverá a entrar en vigor en la Diócesis de Oakland a partir del domingo 15 de agosto de 2021**, día en que celebraremos la Solemnidad de la Asunción de Nuestra Señora al Cielo... How I have longed to celebrate this Passover with you (Luke 22:15). When people ask, "Why should we go to Mass?" I answer, "Because Jesus is waiting for you there in the Church, and He wants to be with you — right there — in the Holy Eucharist." It is about a personal encounter with Jesus that we have as individuals AND as a community, in the celebration of the Mass. The celebration of the Eucharist is the time and place where we can allow Christ to love us, and we can return His love...

When Christ taught "Come to me all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest," I believe He was encouraging us to come to Him where He is most intensely present, in His own Body and Blood on the altar of sacrifice at every Mass. Maybe that explains the socio-

SANTA MARIA GORETTI Patrona de los Jóvenes y de la Pureza

El 6 de marzo es la fiesta de Santa María Goretti, virgen y mártir, su vida es un ejemplo de pureza y misericordia para todos los cristianos. Santa María Goretti es conocida por su compromiso con la pureza y su defensa valerosa de la fe, que la llevó a la tierna edad de once años a morir antes de pecar. Ella además es reconocida por su extraordinaria caridad al perdonar a su agresor en su lecho de muerte.

María nació el 16 de octubre de 1890 en Italia. Cuando María tenía nueve años, su padre, un agricultor, falleció de malaria.

Su madre, entonces, tiene que salir a trabajar para mantener a sus seis hijos, dejando a María encargada de sus hermanos menores. María rezaba el rosario cada noche por el alma de su papá. Ella crecía en gracia y madurez. Todos alrededor de ella notaban su piedad y su obediencia alegre. Ceremonia de Bienvenida Jornada Mundial de la Juventud Panamá 2019 - Parte 1

Queridos jóvenes, ¡buenas tardes!

¡Qué bueno volver a encontrarnos y hacerlo en esta tierra que nos recibe con tanto color y calor! Juntos en Panamá, la Jornada Mundial de la Juventud es otra vez una fiesta, una fiesta de alegría, de esperanza para la Iglesia toda... Hoy me alegra decirles: Pedro está con ustedes para celebrar y renovar la fe y la esperanza. Pedro y la Iglesia caminan con ustedes y queremos decirles que no tengan miedo, que vayan adelante con esa energía renovadora y esa inquietud constante que nos ayuda y moviliza a ser más alegres, más disponibles, más "testigos del Evangelio". Ir adelante no para crear una Iglesia paralela un poco más "divertida" o "cool" en un evento para jóvenes, con algún que otro elemento decorativo, como si a ustedes eso los dejara felices. Pensar así sería no respetarlos y no respetar todo lo que el Espíritu a través de ustedes nos está diciendo.

¡Al contrario! Queremos encontrar y despertar junto a ustedes la continua novedad y juventud de la Iglesia abriéndonos siempre a esa gracia del Espíritu Santo que hace tantas veces un nuevo Pentecostés (cf. Sínodo sobre los Jóvenes, Doc. final, 60). Y eso solo es posible, como lo acabamos de vivir en el Sínodo, si nos animamos a caminar escuchándonos y a escuchar complementándonos, si nos animamos a testimoniar anunciando al Señor en el servicio a nuestros hermanos; que siempre es un servicio concreto, no es un servicio de figuritas, es un servicio concreto.

Bueno yo sé que llegar hasta aquí no fue fácil. Conozco el esfuerzo y el sacrificio que hicieron para poder participar en esta Jornada... El discípulo no es solamente el que llega a un lugar sino el que empieza con decisión, el que no tiene miedo a arriesgar y ponerse a caminar. Empezar a caminar, esa es la mayor alegría del discípulo: estar en camino. Ustedes no tuvieron miedo de arriesgar y de caminar.... Venimos de culturas y pueblos diferentes, hablamos lenguas diferentes, usamos ropas diferentes. ... pero nada de eso impidió poder encontrarnos, tantas diferencias no impidieron poder encontrarnos y estar juntos, divertirnos juntos, celebrar juntos, confesar a Jesucristo juntos, ninguna diferencia nos paró. Y eso es posible porque sabemos que hay alguien que nos une, que nos hermana. Y esto porque tienen ese olfato que sabe intuir que «el amor verdadero no anula las legítimas diferencias, sino que las armoniza en una unidad superior» (Benedicto XVI, Homilía, 25 enero 2006).

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
